KEVIN SMITH


National Head Coach

Kevin Smith has an extensive experience in coaching globally, having started his career in his native city of Liverpool leading the coaching team at the Golden Gloves Boxing Club in Toxteth. From England he moved north to coach the Scottish National Team for 3 years then headed Nigeria's 2012 Olympic Campaign before filling a 2 year consultancy role with the Philippines. Under Coach Kevin the Australian high-performance program has seen great success with a record medal haul at the 2018 Commonwealth Games and numerous podium finishes at the Elite and Youth Boxing World Championships.

National Futures Coach


Jamie is an indigenous former Australian boxer in the middleweight division. In his amateur career, he represented Australia at the 2002 Commonwealth Games, 2003 AIBA Boxing World Championship and 2004 Athens Olympics, before turning pro the following year with an amateur record of 187 fights (150 wins 37 losses). From then on, Pittman held a record of twenty-five bouts throughout his professional career (twenty-two victories, eleven knockouts, and three losses).



AIS COMBAL CENTRE








In 2013 the AIS Combat Centre was established, housing the Boxing Australia training facilities, featuring 2 training rings and 1 Olympic-size ring, 15 bags of various shapes and sizes, 2 uppercut wall bags, 2 speed balls and ample floor space. The Centre also features an area for strength and conditioning involving weights, skipping ropes, exercise bikes and rowing machines. A medical room coming off the Combat Centre floor allows quick access to treatment for our boxers. The AIS Combat Centre is a shared space, also involving training facilities for Judo, Taekwondo and Wrestling.

The Boxing Australia Centre of Excellence (CoE) was developed as a decentralised program within each state and territory. The purpose of the program was to identify talented boxers that have the potential to represent their state or territory at future Australian Championships. The CoE program utilises the facilities at the Combat Centre for multiple National Camps throughout the year.

Men's Boxing

5 Olympic Medals 63 Commonwelath Games Medals 4 World Championship Medals

The National Elite Men's program has a rich history, from Reginald 'Snowy' Baker winning a silver medal more than a century ago at the 1908 Olympic Games, to Justis Huni becoming the youngest ever Australian boxer to medal at a World Championships. The team has had great success at Benchmark Events around the world, the most notable being the Commonwealth Games medal haul, with 60 medals in the 19 editions that have been held over 80+ years. Australia has had boxers participate in 20 of the 30 Olympiads and 15 of the 16 World Championships.

Women's Boxing

6 Commonwealth Games Medals4 World Championship Medals

The National Elite Women's Team represented Australia at the first ever 2001 AIBA Women's World Championships in Scranton, USA and have attended six out of the seven following World Championships.

In 2009, the International Olympic Committee announced that women's boxing would be included in the 2012 Olympic Games where Australia was represented by Naomi Fischer-Rasmussen.

In 2012, the Commonwealth Games
Federation announced that female boxing
was to be included in the 2014
Commonwealth Games. Shelley Watts
won the first Commonwealth Games Gold
for Australia at the Games.
